The engineer discussed his FY02 budget request with the Board for secondary roads and sanitary

disposal.

Mayor Lloyd Benson, City of Urbana, met with the Board to discuss a billing error which resulted in an overpayment by Benton County to Urbana, and also the city's purchase of the Benton Commerce Village water and sewer system. Benson told the Board that the city had over billed the county for maintenance and operation of the water and sewer system in FY00 and that they had agreed to reimburse the county. Benson then submitted a claim for the maintenance and operation of the system for subsequent time periods with the overpayment deducted. The Board accepted the claim and forwarded it to the auditor for payment. Mayor Benson also spoke to the Board regarding the purchase of the water and sewer system in Benton Commerce Village by the City of Urbana. Benson asked if the Board would honor the prior Board's agreement to sell the system. The Board advised that they would proceed with the sale of the system. Benson advised that attorney Bob Josten would draft an agreement for consideration.

Judy Funk of Gallagher Benefit Services (GBS) met with the Board to discuss services she could provide to Benton County for various employee benefits. Funk explained how GBS could assist the county specifically with a self-funded health insurance program and her company's qualifications. The Board did not take any action.

Representatives of the Benton County Library Association met with the Board to request additional funding in FY02. Discussion was held on the formulas used by other counties for funding libraries and the current funding that Benton County provides. The librarians also discussed their revenue sources and the correlation between funding by governmental entities. Supervisor Buch advised that he would not be opposed to increasing funding. The Board did not take any formal action on the request.

Moved by Vermedahl, seconded by Buch, to direct the auditor to include \$5,000.00 in the FY02 budget for replacement of rural addressing signs. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

The Board also discussed surveying the county to assess the number of rural addressing signs that need replacement. Steve Meyer, Vice-President of the Benton County Firemen's Association, was asked to discuss the possibility of having the fire departments conduct the survey at the organization's next meeting.

The Board did not take any action on the ordinance governing rural addressing.

Mike Beumer, the Benton County weed commissioner, met with the Board to discuss chemical quotes for FY02. Beumer advised that he sent out six requests for quotes but only received a quote from Fisher's Feed & Fertilizer. Moved by Buch, seconded by Vermedahl, to purchase chemicals for weed and brush control for FY02 from Fisher's Feed & Fertilizer at a cost of \$39,657.50. All members voting "aye" thereon. Representatives of Benton Development Group (BDG) met with the Board to seek additional funding in FY02. BDG is requesting funding from Benton County in the amount of \$49,734.85. Supervisor Vermedahl requested a list of businesses and projects that BDG has brought to Benton County since its inception. Katherine Ollendieck advised that she would compile a list and bring it back to the Board. The Board did not take any action on the funding request.

The Board did not take action on the payment of the Vinton special assessment.

Mary Williams, Benton County Social Services Director, presented her FY02 budget request to the Board. The Board did not take any action.

The Benton County Board of Supervisors met in regular adjourned session at the Benton County Courthouse with Supervisors Sass, Vermedahl, and Buch present. Chairman Sass called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Moved by Buch, seconded by Vermedahl, to approve the minutes of January 19, 2001, and January 22, 2001. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

Myron Parizek, the county engineer met with the Board to discuss the county's nepotism policy. Parizek requested that the Board either modifies the county's policy or allows waivers to it. The engineer would like to be able to hire relatives of employees for part-time work and job shadowing opportunities. The Board requested that the matter be placed on the agenda for February 2, 2001, at 1:00 p.m. for discussion with all elected officials and department heads.

Discussion on the county's dust control program was discussed. Supervisor Buch asked what the actual cost to the county was to provide this service. The engineer advised that the cost is probably in the vicinity of \$.94 per foot while the county is only charging \$.78 per foot.

Steve Meyer, Vice-President of the Benton County Firemen's Association, reported that he had contacted the various fire departments in Benton County regarding the survey of the rural addressing system. Meyer advised that all fire departments are willing to help the county with the survey and will attempt to have it completed by the first part of May. The Board thanked Meyer and the fire departments for their assistance.

The county engineer discussed potential legislation affecting the State's Ground Protection Fund and the senate's action to take money from the fund to assist with heating bills.

Gordon Sevig presented a petition to the Board concerning the Linn-Benton road between Walford and Highway 30. The document petitioned "the Board of Supervisors for Benton County and Linn County, Iowa, to pave or asphalt the Linn-Benton County Road from Walford to Highway 30" and contained approximately 75 signatures. The road is approximately four to five miles long. Sevig told the Board that there would be more use by commuters to Amana if the road were paved. Supervisor Buch stated that he could understand the concern of the petitioners due to the traffic utilizing the road. Sevig advised that he has had applied dust control to the road for the last several years but really needs something more permanent. The engineer advised that the agreement between Benton County and Linn County on that road is a fifty-fifty construction cost, but Benton County is responsible for the total maintenance. Supervisor Vermedahl asked if seal coating would be appropriate on that particular road. Sevig stated that sealcoating on the portion of the road located in the City of Walford has held up well. Buch asked if this was a farmto-market road and the engineer advised that it was and that classification will provide for additional funding options. Buch asked that the engineer contact Linn County to get their input stating that he believed something needed be done on the road due to the traffic. Sass questioned the need to replace structures on the road should it be upgraded. The engineer stated there was only one structure that would need to be replaced in a year or two, and the bridge would not need to be upgraded. Vermedahl asked Sevig about the amount of truck usage to determine if a sealcoated road would stand up to the traffic. Sevig responded that only his smaller trucks used the road and that he believed that sealcoating again would be adequate. Sass stated that due to the low traffic count on that road that there would be rural subdivisions with higher traffic counts wanting sealcoated roads also. The engineer echoed that comment. Buch stated that the road's proximity to 151 would generate more traffic if it were sealcoated. Vermedahl stated that the county's construction program should be reviewed before making any commitments to the project. Sevig asked if consideration could be given to an upgrade just between Walford and his warehouse. Sevig offered to assist with the project if necessary. The engineer spoke to the county's past direction on upgrades to gravel roads to subdivisions stating it was one hundred percent the subdivision's responsibility. The engineer also reported that the county's past position on upgrades from dirt to gravel was fifty- percent participation between the county and the requestor. The engineer questioned if this same

type of proposal would require participation from the petitioners. Buch advised Sevig that there was nothing in the construction plan for upgrading the road for the current year and may not be able to be included for several years dependent upon research by the Board.

Vermedahl moved that the engineer be directed to bring information back to the Board regarding the county's long range plan for the roads in Benton County in conjunction with the Iowa Department of Transportation Construction Program, the associated costs for improvement of roads, and the level of participation of other entities and individuals. Supervisor Buch seconded the motion. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

Renae Tharp of Benton Development Group met with the Board to discuss producing a new map for Benton County. Tharp asked what the direction of the Board was relative to the project and funding. #### **RESOLUTION #01-6**

## ADOPTING JOB DESCRIPTION FOR BENTON COUNTY WEED COMMISSIONER/BRUSH CONTROL

WHEREAS, Benton County has appointed a weed commissioner; and

WHEREAS, the weed commissioner position includes duties for brush and weed control; and

WHEREAS, the board of supervisors and the weed commissioner desire to adopt a job description for the position of weed commissioner,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Benton County Board of Supervisors that the following job description be adopted:

## JOB DESCRIPTION FOR THE POSITION OF WEED COMMISSIONER

## I. JOB DESCRIPTION OF WEED COMMISSIONER

## A. REQUIREMENTS FOR THE POSITION:

An individual appointed by the Board of Supervisors who passes the minimum standards established by the Iowa Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship. See Iowa Code Section 317.3.

## B. DUTIES OF THE WEED COMMISSIONER

1. The weed commissioner is appointed annually by the Benton County Board of Supervisors; the appointment is effective March 1st. As an appointed Department Head, the Weed Commissioner fulfills the Commissioner's duties as set forth in Iowa Code Chapter 317, subject to the direction and control of the Board. Iowa Code Section 317.4 states that the Weed Commissioner, shall, subject to the direction and control of the Board, "supervise the control and destruction of all noxious weeds in the County, including those growing within the limits of cities, within the confines of abandoned cemeteries, and along the streets and highways unless otherwise provided." Section 317.4 also specifically provides that the Weed Commissioner shall notify the Director of Public Safety or other appropriate law enforcement agency of the location of any Marijuana plants found growing on public or private property. Section 317.4 also authorizes that the Commissioner may enter upon any land in the County at any time for the performance of the Commissioner's duties, and shall hire the labor and purchase the equipment necessary, subject to the approval of the Board, to accomplish the Commissioner's duties.

The Commissioner shall attend all continuing educational programs required to keep the Commissioner's commercial applicator's license current and shall ensure that all employees under the Commissioner's direction or control maintain their educational requirements so that their certifications are current.

The Commissioner shall perform the duties contained in Iowa Code Section 317.6 regarding the investigation of noxious weed complaints including sending the appropriate notices as required by Iowa law. The Commissioner shall prepare an annual report to the Board on or before November 1st of each year, in writing, as required by Iowa Code Section 317.7.

- 2. In addition to the statutory duties of the Weed Commission to control noxious weeds, the Weed Commissioner in Benton County is required by the Board of Supervisors to perform the following duties:
  - a. Control all brush growing in the County's right-of-way along all roads maintained by Benton County, Iowa, unless prohibited by law.
  - b. Shall report quarterly to the Board on the Department's activities and progress in controlling noxious weeds and brush control in the County.
  - c. Shall be the Department Head, and as such, shall be responsible for supervising all employees under the Commissioner's direction and control. It is the Commissioner's further responsibility as a Department Head to administer all applicable policies as set forth by the Benton County Employee Handbook.
  - d. As a Department Head, the Commissioner shall be responsible for preparing his annual budget.
  - e. The Commissioner shall be responsible for maintaining the equipment under the Department's control and making sure that all appropriate maintenance of same is completed.
  - f. Shall advise the Board of any emergency situations which require immediate response when the Commissioner believes the Commissioner's Department lacks the necessary personnel and/or equipment to perform the duties of said Department.

- g. Shall coordinate with the County Engineer in all matters requiring the joint cooperation of Secondary Roads and the Weed Department.
- h. Shall comply with the work schedule as set forth by the Board.

Further, said position is to be classified as a non-exempt department head for purposes of the federal Fair Labor Standards Act.

Coulter explained that economic development is hard to sell to communities and the affect economic development has on them. Coulter explained that replacement of the executive director could be quite costly and asked that the Benton Development Group be solely funded by Benton County. Coulter stated that although the organization is asking for considerable more money from Benton County, the county has already received a large benefit from the organization. Dell Hanson commented that many people believe BDG is a realtor and don't realize that BDG is just an information center. Hanson further commented that users of the service "dropped the ball" not BDG in past activities. Hanson echoed that more money would be needed if BDG were to survive. Marty Junge commented that the board and the director spend a considerable amount of time going back to the cities year after year to explain what had been done for them and asking for their continued financial support. Junge said that the process of obtaining funding is time consuming and taking time away from other matters. Junge also added that non-member communities are getting the benefit of BDG even though they don't belong. BDG requested that the county fund the organization in an amount of \$100,000.00 for the next fiscal year. Katherine Ollendieck stated that amount would cover the services currently being provided but did not include additional funding for education, marketing, etc. Supervisor Sass commented that many of the concerns he had heard were that communities were not getting their money's worth. Vermedahl questioned what the vision of BDG was or would be if the county were the sole sponsor. Vermedahl asked what BDG was going to do for marketing. Vermedahl stated that if the county is to spend \$100,000 we should have some very specific ideas on what things are going to happen. No decisions were made by the board of supervisors regarding the request.

Moved by Vermedahl, seconded by Buch, to appoint Marty Ternus to the 2001 Eminent Domain Commission as an owner/operator of agricultural land. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried. The board worked on budget matters at various times during the meeting.

The county attorney also requested that the wage increase for Ashlyn Kremenak be reconsidered but due to Supervisor Sass being absent, the matter was placed on the March 13<sup>th</sup> agenda along with further discussion on the attorney's FY02 budget.

The county attorney spoke to the board about his concerns over the posting and holding of board meetings outside of the regular Tuesday and Friday meetings. Thompson was not aware, as were other departments not aware, of the February 26<sup>th</sup> meeting when the board took action on employee wages for FY02. Thompson advised that he spoke with the sheriff, health/land use, and data processing departments who were also unaware of the meeting. Thompson stated that the board meeting was in accordance with law, but believed that notice should have been given to each department individually. Vermedahl stated that the agendas were published and posted in the same manner as in the past and did not want to make any deviation from that procedure but appreciated the county attorney's comments.

Moved by Buch, seconded by Vermedahl, to adjourn. Both members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

The Board discussed landscaping the southeast corner of the courthouse yard. John Fischer has offered to pay for all materials and provide labor for the project. Fischer had requested that the county also provide labor with the cement work. The Board spoke with the county engineer regarding the proposal and providing labor from secondary roads. The engineer was directed to coordinate and work with Fischer on the landscaping project.

Moved by Buch, seconded by Vermedahl, to approve the Liquor License and Sunday Sales Permit for Benton Golf Club, Inc. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

The county attorney met with the Board to request a larger wage increase in FY02 for his parttime secretaries. The attorney stated that currently Ashlyn Kremenak is earning \$7.50 per hour and requested that her FY02 wage be set at \$9.00 per hour. The attorney also requested that Betty Stone's wage be set at \$14.00 per hour in FY02 which would be an increase of \$1.00 per hour. Supervisor Vermedahl abstained from all comment due to a conflict of interest.

Moved by Buch, seconded by Sass, to set the wage of Ashlyn Kremenak for FY02 at \$8.00 per hour. Buch and Sass voting "aye" thereon. Vermedahl abstained. Motion carried.

Brian Gruhn presented the agreement reached between Benton County and the secondary roads employees' union. The Union has ratified the agreement and Gruhn was requesting Board approval. The agreement is for one year and provides for a 3.5% increase in hourly wage rates and allows eight hours of an employee's sick leave to be used for illness of spouse or child, and other language changes. Moved by Buch, seconded by Vermedahl, to approve the agreement between Benton County Secondary Roads and Public, Professional & Maintenance Employees Local Union 2003 International Brotherhood of Painters & Allied Trades, AFL-CIO.

Moved by Vermedahl, seconded by Buch, to adjourn. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

The Benton County Board of Supervisors met in regular adjourned session at the Benton County Courthouse with Supervisors Vermedahl and Buch present. Vice-Chairman Vermedahl called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Supervisor Sass arrived at 9:10 a.m.

Moved by Buch, seconded by Vermedahl, to approve the minutes of March 6, 2001. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

Discussion was held on the placement of lighting on the south side of the courthouse. Concerns were made about the lack of lighting on the flag and potential hazards with the current spotlight's placement. The Board decided to research the matter further by trying different placements of the light.

The county engineer met with the board and discussed landfill issues and the scrap tire amnesty program. The engineer recommended that the tire amnesty be held on April 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup>. Vermedahl commented about the program not being offered on a Saturday when more people could participate. The engineer also discussed a tire education program being organized by the East Central Iowa Council of Governments (ECICOG) on May 5<sup>th</sup>. ECICOG has selected John's Tire in Vinton, Iowa to participate in the program.

The engineer spoke to permitting regulations at the landfill and that the Department of Natural Resources has banned burning of any yard waste at the landfill, including tree limbs.

The time of 9:30 a.m. having arrived, and this being the time and date set for a public hearing on a land use change requested by David Birch, the board took up the matter for consideration. Marc Greenlee presented the technical review in accordance with the Benton County Agricultural Land Use Preservation Ordinance. The request is for a change to a single residential use. Richart stated that citizens want the best people in the elected positions and the county should compensate the elected officials accordingly. Supervisor Buch commented that the elected officials received a large increase last year. Richart responded that the elected officials were significantly behind in their salaries and the compensation board has been attempting to rectify the matter. Richart stated that past budget cuts were accomplished by reducing the salaries of the elected officials and consequently the elected officials have fallen behind. Richart thanked the board for considering the compensation board's recommendations. Supervisor Vermedahl stated that he attended the compensation board's meeting and listened to the compensation

board deliberate. Vermedahl said he appreciated the thought and understood the compensation board's philosophy but that he would not expect the other county employees to accept an increase that he as an elected official was not willing to accept.

Moved by Vermedahl, seconded by Buch, to decrease the compensation board's recommended increases by 34.4% for the elected officials in FY02. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

## UTILITY AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into between the City of Urbana, Iowa (the "City"), and Benton County (the "County"), as of the 20th day of March, 2001.

**WHEREAS,** the City has established the Urbana Urban Renewal Area (the "City Urban Renewal Area") and has made provisions for incurring debt payable from incremental property taxes, and

WHEREAS, the County has established the Benton Commerce Village Urban Renewal Area (the "County Urban Renewal Area"); and

WHEREAS, the County has constructed various water and sanitary sewer lines within the County Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Utilities"), has issued general obligation bonds (the "GO Bonds") and tax increment revenue promissory notes (the "TIF Notes") in order to finance such construction (the "County Debt"), and has pledged future incremental property tax revenues generated within the County Urban Renewal Area to the payment of the TIF Notes, and

WHEREAS, the City and the County entered into an agreement dated October 13, 1995 (the "1995 Agreement"), with respect to the County Urban Renewal Area and the Urban Renewal Utilities, which addressed the subject of incremental property tax revenues generated within the County Urban Renewal Area; and

WHEREAS, the County has contracted with the City to operate and maintain the Urban Renewal Utilities; and

WHEREAS, the City intends to annex the property located within the County Urban Renewal Area; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the intent of the parties that the City would ultimately own and become fully responsible for the Urban Renewal Utilities, and that, to the extent possible, the City would be able to generate revenues from users of the Urban Renewal Utilities which could be paid to the County and applied against the County Debt;

Now, Therefore, in consideration of the mutual obligations contained in this Agreement, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. It is the intent of the parties that this Agreement shall supercede and replace the 1995 Agreement.
- 2. The County will continue to collect and receive all incremental tax revenues generated from properties located within the County Urban Renewal Area, including

those properties which are also located within the overlapping portion of the City Urban Renewal Area, and will use such revenues, first, to make payments on the TIF Notes, and second, to make payments of principal and interest on the GO Bonds or to reimburse the County for such payments. The City agrees that it will have no claim on any incremental tax revenues generated within the County Urban Renewal Area, including those properties which are also located within the overlapping portion of the City Urban Renewal Area, until such time as all outstanding principal of and interest on both the GO Bonds and the TIF Notes have been repaid.

The parties agree to enter into a Contract of Sale with respect to the Urban Renewal Utilities as soon as possible, pursuant to which the City will pay the County \$1.00 and other proper consideration on the effective date of such Contract and another \$1.00 on the date that the County Debt is retired, with the understanding that the County will not transfer title to the Urban Renewal Utilities to the City until the County Debt has been retired and payment of the second \$1.00 had been made. The Contract of Sale will state that the City will accept full responsibility for the Urban Renewal Utilities on the effective date of such Contract and that the County will not be responsible for any costs of operation, maintenance or repairs with respect to the Urban Renewal Utilities after that date.

After the effective date of the Contract of Sale, the City will be responsible for obtaining all necessary governmental permits, which are required in order to be authorized to operate the Urban Renewal Utilities. The City will operate and maintain the Urban Renewal Utilities as part of the City's municipal water and sewer utility systems, and will set and collect user fees which will be sufficient to cover operation and maintenance costs and to pay principal of and interest on existing and future revenue debt and to maintain necessary reserves therefor. To the extent possible, the City will maintain records which reflect the revenues and costs of operation and maintenance related to the users of the Urban Renewal Utilities. In addition, at the end of each fiscal year, the City will pay to the County a proportionate share of any surplus revenues from the City's municipal water and sewer utility systems, calculated by dividing the amount of revenue produced from users of the Urban Renewal Utilities by the total amount of revenue produced from users of the municipal water and sewer utility systems. Surplus revenues shall mean those amounts remaining after the payment of all operation and maintenance expenses, principal of and interest on any City water or sewer revenue debt and establishment or maintenance of necessary or required reserves.

The City agrees, as part of its annexation process, that it will not offer or approve any form of general property tax abatement, pursuant to Chapters 404 or 427B of the Code of Iowa, with respect to any property which is located within the County Urban Renewal Area, but that it may include as part of an annexation agreement, a phasing in of the City portion of the consolidated property tax levy.

- 6. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the successors and assigns of the parties.
- 7. This Agreement shall be deemed to be a contract made under the laws of the State of Iowa and for all purposes shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Iowa.

The City and County have caused this Agreement to be signed, and their respective seals to be affixed, in its name and on its behalf by its duly authorized officers, all as of the day and date written above.

# **RESOLUTION #01-20**

# DESTRUCTION OF NOXIOUS WEEDS

**Be It Resolved** by the Board of Supervisors of Benton County, Iowa that pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 317, Code of Iowa, 2000, it is hereby ordered:

1. That each owner and each person in the possession or control of any lands in Benton County shall cut, burn or otherwise destroy all noxious weeds thereon, as defined in this chapter, at such times in each year and in such manner as shall prevent said weeds from blooming or coming to maturity, and shall keep said lands free from such growth of any other weeds as shall render the streets or highways adjoining said land unsafe for public travel. Noxious weeds shall be cut or otherwise destroyed on or before the following dates and as often thereafter as is necessary to prevent seed production:

Group 1. May 20, 2001 to June 5, 2001, for Leafy Spurge, Perennial Peppergrass, Sour Dock, Smooth Dock and Sheep Sorrel.

Group 2. By June 1, 2001 for Canadian Thistle, Russian Knapweed, Buckhorn, Wild Mustard and Buckthorn.

Group 3. July 1, 2001 to July 15, 2001, for Field Bindweed, Wild Carrot, Poison Hemlock, Multiflora Rose, Horse Nettle, Perennial Sow Thistle, Quack Grass, Butterprint' Puncture Vine, Cocklebur, Bull Thistle, Musk Thistle, Wild Sunflower and Teasel.

2. That each owner and each person in the possession or control of any lands in Benton County infested with any of the following noxious weeds shall adopt a program of weed destruction described by the Weed Commissioner, which in five years may be expected to destroy and will immediately keep under control such infestations of said noxious weeds.

(a) Primary Noxious Weeds: Quack Grass, Perennial Sow Thistle, Canada Thistle, Bull Thistle, European Morning Glory or Field Bindweed, Horse Nettle, Leafy spurge, Perennial Peppergrass, Russian Knapweed, and Buckthorn.

(b) Secondary Noxious Weeds: Butterprint, Cocklebur, Wild Mustard, Puncture Vine, Teasel, Wild Carrot, Buckhorn, Sheep Sorrel, Sour Dock, Smooth Dock, Poison Hemlock, Wild Sunflower, Multiflora Rose and Shattercane.

3. That if the owners or persons in possession or control of any land in Benton County fails to comply with the foregoing orders, the Weed Commissioner shall cause this to be done and the expense of said work, including costs of serving notice and other costs, if any, shall be assessed against the real estate.

4. That the County Auditor is hereby directed to cause notice of the making and entering of the foregoing order by one publication in each of the official newspapers of the County.

Moved by Vermedahl, seconded by Buch, to approve a utility permit for South Slope Telephone to place utility lines in Sections 12 and 13 of Eldorado Township and Section 7 of Fremont Township. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

The county engineer presented his five-year construction program for secondary roads. The plan contains paving projects including but is not limited to the Oak Grove to Linn County road, re-paving the road north of Keystone and re-paving the Atkins/ Shellsburg road. The engineer also discussed the various bridge replacement projects contained in the five-year plan.

Discussion was also held on the request to hard surface the road north of Walford on the Linn-Benton line. The engineer reported the traffic count conducted by the Department of Transportation in 1997 on that road did not support a hard surface when the county had many other gravel roads with higher traffic counts. The improvement to the road was not included in the county's five-year plan.

The Board recommended that BDG approach the member communities about additional funding for the fiscal year.

Supervisor Vermedahl returned to the meeting.

The time of 9:30 a.m. having arrived and this being the time and date set for a public hearing on a land use change requested by Break Point Stores, Inc., the board took up the matter for consideration. Due to the large number of people in attendance, this portion of the board's meeting was held in the third floor courtroom. The proposed change is for the purpose of constructing a convenience store/gas station. The location of the proposed site is at the intersection of Highway 30 and County Road 201. Marc Greenlee, Land Use Administrator presented the technical review in accordance with the county's Agricultural Land Use Preservation Ordinance. Secondary Roads indicated that the sight distance and 10% rule were met but a culvert would be needed for the driveway and the entire three hundred foot ditch would have to be cleaned. Secondary Roads also noted that snow removal is not available to that area twenty-four hours a day/seven days a week. Greenlee reported that the Department of Transportation had not received an actual application and therefore could not specifically address the issue but some concerns included paving the county road, turning lanes on Highway 30, and potential drainage problems. The proposed use would utilize rural water. Greenlee reported that the amount of wastewater per day did not meet the requirements for the Department of Natural Resources to regulate it and that a septic tank with a sand filter and trench absorption system was proposed but there may be a need for septic tanks with no discharge. Greenlee added that if there were discharge a DNR permit would be required. The current use of land in the area is predominately agricultural with some rural residential. There are approximately thirty homes in a rural subdivision south of the intersection where the land use change is being sought. The corn suitability rating (CSR) for the actual site is approximately a 65. Greenlee continued to advise that the Benton County, Iowa Land Preservation and Use Plan speaks to compatibility of uses and rates residential use in agricultural areas as medium compatibility, however commercial use in agricultural and/or residential areas is low

compatibility. Greenlee reported that ten adjacent property owners were notified with responses being received by various individuals.

The applicants were given the opportunity to speak about the project. Steve Adams of Break Pointe Stores, Inc. explained that a consulting firm was hired to determine the best location for the site. Adams spoke to the size of the facility and the number of fueling stations being planned. Adams advised that there would not be a lounge or hang-out for drivers. He explained that Break Pointe would comply with all directives from the Department of Transportation and Benton County Engineer. Adams spoke to the need for a convenience store and gas station on Highway 30 noting that there was none between Tama and Cedar Rapids. Adams continued to state that there was no where for people to get gas, go to for emergency needs, or restroom facilities. Adams advised that if complying with the regulations set forth by the Department of Transportation and Benton County became too expensive, or if the Department of Transportation found that the location would not be safe, then the project would be dropped. Adams noted that Break Pointe, Inc. is concerned about safety also.

Supervisor Sass questioned if additional land would be needed for landscaping and noted that it would be difficult to farm the high CSR ground immediately adjacent to the proposed project. The applicants indicated that no additional ground would be needed. Sass also voiced his concern about approving land use changes prior to resolving any safety concerns such as turning traffic on Highway 30 and that he would prefer to see a report from the Department of Transportation first.

Supervisor Vermedahl questioned the applicants as to the viability of the project being located that far off the roadway and was concerned about the business failing and an empty building remaining. Vermedahl also asked who would pay for the improvements to Highway 30 and the county roads if they were needed. The applicants advised they would be responsible for payment of any portion that was determined to be their expense. Vermedahl also commented about granting a land use change when not all issues had been addressed. Vermedahl voiced concern over the distance off the roadway, the CSR of the area, and the project's proximity to residential sites and its impact on the quality of life. The applicants commented that they would not be able to proceed with the project until all government requirements were met and that it was up to the county and the state as to what those requirements would be.

Supervisor Buch questioned the location of the project stating that it was too close to Cedar Rapids if the intent was to provide a store halfway between Tama and Cedar Rapids and that he would prefer to see a more centralized location. Buch also commented that the Board was there to represent the people and that the Board has an obligation to those people. Buch further commented that he believed the applicants constructed good facilities but he had to consider the number of people opposing the project's location and reiterated that he believed the project was located too close to Cedar Rapids and that he was concerned about the impact on the intersection.

Oral and written comments opposing the project were received. Comments included safety concerns with increased traffic, congestion of exiting and entering vehicles, environmental concerns, storage of petroleum products, the detrimental affect of light, air, and noise pollution, potential use that is away from immediate emergency services, potential for increased crime and non-compatibility with surrounding uses. A petition containing numerous signatures opposing the proposal was presented. The applicants responded that all infrastructure and safety issues would strictly comply with Department of Transportation and Benton County requirements.

Hearing all comments, it was moved by Vermedahl to deny the request for a land use change to nonagricultural on approximately 3.77 acres located in a Part of the SE1/4 of the SE1/4 of 29-83-9 (Fremont Township) for a convenience store/gas station. The denial is due to the proposed use not meeting all of the necessary criteria established in the Benton County, Iowa Agricultural Land Preservation Ordinance (the "Ordinance") specifically:

The purpose and objectives of the Ordinance includes to preserve the availability of agricultural land, encourage efficient urban development patterns, and to secure safety from other dangers such as the intersection. Further, section 2.5 of the Ordinance provides that the County Board must find that the use does not interfere seriously with farm operations in the area (2.52) and the use does not materially alter the stability of the overall land use pattern in the area (2.53).

Supervisor Buch seconded the motion. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried denying the land use change.

The Board returned to the second floor boardroom for the remainder of the meeting.

The time of 10:15 having arrived, and this being the time and date set for a public hearing on a land use change requested by Ted and Luanna Walton, the board took up the matter for consideration.

Marc Greenlee presented the technical review in accordance with the Benton County Agricultural Land Use Preservation Ordinance. The request is for a change to a single residential use. Hearing all comment, it was moved by Buch, seconded by Vermedahl, to approve a land use change on approximately one acre located in a Part of the NE1/4 of the NE1/4 of 34-82-12 (Iowa Township) for a single residential use. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

The time of 10:45 a.m. having arrived, and this being the time and date set for the second consideration of a proposed ordinance regulating On-Site Waste Water Treatment and Disposal Systems, the Board took up the matter for its second consideration. Notice of this public hearing had been made in accordance with Iowa law. Notice had included the necessary language to allow the Board to waive future considerations if so desired and copies were available in the office of the county auditor. The auditor reported that no comments had been received prior to this hearing. Chairman Sass opened the public hearing. There were no members of the public present. Hearing no comment either for or against the proposed ordinance, the Chairman declared the hearing closed. Moved by Vermedahl, seconded by Buch, to approve the second consideration of Ordinance #38, On-Site Waste Water Treatment and Disposal Systems as presented. Vermedahl further moved, and Buch seconded, that due to no public interest being heard either at the first consideration or the second consideration, that the third consideration be waived. Voting "aye" were Sass, Vermedahl, and Buch. Motion carried.

Moved by Vermedahl, seconded by Buch, that Ordinance #38, On-Site Waste Water Treatment and Disposal Systems be adopted in full as presented and the auditor is directed to make the necessary publications in accordance with law. Voting "aye" were Sass, Vermedahl, and Buch. "Nays" none. Motion carried.

Mary Williams met with the Board to discuss the rate setting proposal that Benton County entered into and a meeting scheduled with the Cedar Valley Ranch to discuss the requirements that the Ranch must comply with. Williams requested that a board member attend the meeting to answer questions that may arise concerning the contract between Benton County and the Cedar Valley Ranch.

Gary Fordice and Dave Henkel, Conservation Board Chairman, updated the Board on conservation activities. Fordice advised that the Iowa Association of County Conservation Boards would be drafting proposed legislation to make rangers the same as other peace officers under Iowa Public Employers Retirement. Discussion also was held as to conservation department's FY02 budget. The Board of Supervisors budgeted \$85, 690.00 in administration and \$344,502.00 for operations for FY02. The new budget presented by conservation shifted funding to \$96,990.00 in administration and \$333,202.00 for operations. Supervisor Buch questioned why the shift in funding was needed. Fordice advised that it was mainly to meet increases in wages in the administration portion of the budget. Buch questioned how the money was found in the operations budget to allow for the shift. Fordice answered that he purchased two used dump trucks from secondary roads instead of purchasing two new trucks. Buch commented that he did not like the large wage increases being given to conservation employees. Fordice responded that salaries needed to be increased to keep employees. Buch asked if the other counties offered the same benefits such as housing. Fordice advised that Linn County starts their rangers at \$29,000.00 and provides housing but charges rent. Iowa and Buchanan Counties provide housing and all utilities to their rangers. Vermedahl commented that he did not like the amount of wage increases. The Board advised that the shift in funding would require a budget amendment by the supervisors at a later date.

Chris Taliga and Kirk Henderson discussed the Integrated Roadside Vegetation Management Program and associated inventory. Henderson told the Board about the assistance available to counties with roadside vegetation management through the Roadside Management Program, Iowa Department of Transportation and the Iowa Living Roadway Trust Fund. The Board indicated that they were interested in the program and would begin the steps necessary to utilize the assistance offered.

Moved by Buch, seconded by Vermedahl, to approve a Beer Permit for the Watkins Athletic Club. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

Moved by Vermedahl, seconded by Buch, to set the following dates and times for consideration on Ordinance #39 Establishing the Penalty for County Infractions and Ordinance #40 Readopting the Existing Benton County Code of Ordinances and /or Repealing Certain Portions Therein: June 5, 2001, June 8, 2001, and June 12, 2001 at 10:00 a.m. for Ordinance #39 and 10:15 a.m. for Ordinance #40. Thereafter, the Board took up the amendment to the budget for final consideration and determined that said budget be amended as follows:

All line items shall be amended where necessary within each department budget. All departmental appropriations are amended to reflect the above increases/decreases in expenditures.

It is also noted that \$287,992 reflected in Benton County's fund balance is reserved in accordance with Benton County Resolution #97-25, as amended, for the financial assurance of closure and postclosure costs for the Benton County sanitary landfill. The amount is reduced from the published notice due to interest income not yet being received.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that an unreserved fund balance designation for the purpose of election equipment replacement be established and that an initial amount of \$75,000 be designated for said purpose. The designation of unreserved fund balances indicates that Benton County prefers to use available financial resources for the specific purpose of election equipment replacement, and although designated, the funds remain an integral part of the spendable or appropriable resources of Benton County.

There will be no tax increase for FY01. This resolution adopted on the 15th day of May 2001.

The Benton County Board of Supervisors met in regular adjourned session at the Newhall City Hall in Newhall with Supervisors Sass, Vermedahl, and Buch present. Chairman Sass called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Moved by Buch, seconded by Vermedahl, to approve the minutes of May 18, 2001. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

Doug Elliott, East Central Iowa Council of Governments (ECICOG) met with the Board to discuss the services offered by the organization. Elliott also explained that his organization usually provides services to government entities, but on occasion will assist with a private project. The purpose of the meeting was to educate the Board of Supervisors as to the services offered by ECICOG and Benton Development Group to prevent duplication of services.

Moved by Vermedahl, seconded by Buch, to set a land use hearing requested by Vernon Kuhn for June 22, 2001, at 9:30 a.m. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

Moved by Vermedahl, seconded by Buch, to acknowledge the hire of Dan Sallee and Josh Appelgarth as part-time seasonal employees with the conservation department, effective May 21, 2001, at a wage of \$8.00 per hour. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

Moved by Buch, seconded by Vermedahl, to approve the Recorder's Quarterly Report for the period ending March 31, 2001. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

Bob Moen and representatives of John Deere Insurance met with the Board to discuss health insurance. Discussion included the potential savings if the county would switch to John Deere health insurance and the differences between the John Deere plan and the county's current health insurance plan. The Board directed that the matter be placed on the May 25, 2001 agenda for further consideration.

Dave Thompson met with the Board to discuss the space allocated to his office. Thompson relayed his confusion over the May 14<sup>th</sup> Board action allowing him use of office on the third floor but also providing a key to the clerk of court. Thompson advised that the May 14<sup>th</sup> motion was illegal stating the Board does not have the authority to direct the county attorney to give a key to someone allowing them access to his records. The county attorney advised that the Board's authority is restricted to providing space to an official in order for that official to operate his/her office. Thompson further told the Board that he was not going to provide a key to anyone under the Board's directive.

Thompson also told the Board that if the Board is making any decisions that affect his office that he would requested to be present. Thompson voiced concern over the fact that the matter concerning the extra office on the third floor was originally scheduled for 11:30 a.m. on May 14th and was held earlier. Thompson stated that he came to the Board to ask if they had any questions regarding the office issue and was told that the Board had none and the Board continued on with other matters. The Board then issued a decision on the matter while he was not present. Thompson reiterated that it was necessary for him to know matters that affect his office and he expects to be allowed to be present when the Board takes such action.

Thompson also informed the Board of the duties required of his office and the ability to perform those requirements with limited personnel. Thompson stated that he could probably use an additional fulltime assistant attorney but was not asking for one, but wanted to show the Board what his office does handle. The county attorney displayed several boxes of files to demonstrate the need for an area to lay out cases to allow him or his assistant to prepare legal action. The county attorney stated that he needs the ability to lay information out and leave it on a table and know it is secure. The county attorney stated that if he is not able to utilize the office as needed, then he was officially requesting additional room to be able to efficiently perform the duties of his office. Thompson commented that he would be willing to discuss an office in the building being planned for the sheriff's and transportation departments.

Thompson commented that he was confused over the use of the dumbwaiter located in the office being discussed. Thompson displayed the size of his files compared to those of the clerk of court indicating that the clerk's files are small in relation to the size of the county attorney's records for the same case. Thompson stressed that the dumbwaiter was not used until he requested sole use of the office.

Thompson stressed that he does not have the room to do his job in the way that victims and residents of Benton County deserve. Thompson finished by stating that he thought the use of the office was the most efficient and cost-effective for Benton County.

A member of the public commented that she was offended by the county attorney's talk about murders and rapes in a public meeting stating that the issue was the need for more room and there was no need to discuss specific cases or bring evidence about those cases.

Vermedahl commented that the courts told the Board that they use the dumbwaiter and he wasn't going to question the judge. Thompson responded that the logical answer to the problem is to move the door to the dumbwaiter to the outside wall which could be done for under \$1000.00. Moving the door would allow the clerk to use the dumbwaiter and maintain a secure room for his office to use.

Sass commented that regarding the May 14<sup>th</sup> action being taken without Thompson present was due to Judge Remley's name being on the agenda and not Thompson's. Sass also commented that the room

was to allow storage for the county attorney and not for other office use. Thompson advised that he has always wanted to use the room for other things besides storage and had told the Board of his intentions.

Buch commented that he didn't believe the room would be large enough to do what the county attorney proposed referring to all of the records shown to the Board. Thompson stated that he believed the room would be satisfactory. Thompson also stated that he has never criticized the district court or Judge Remley but he (Thompson) had not witnessed the dumbwaiter being used until recently. Thompson also told the Board that he had old oak trim from a school that matched the trim in the courthouse and he would donate those materials if the opening to the dumbwaiter was relocated.

Vermedahl asked if Thompson had contacted any contractors about the cost of moving the door to the dumbwaiter. Thompson replied that he had not, but in his opinion based on past experience with carpentry and contractors that the door could be relocated for less than \$1000.00.

Thompson also reminded the Board that money is available from the State of Iowa to hire an intern to assist his office at no cost to Benton County if there was a room available.

Vermedahl stated that he never believed that the Board was issuing keys to his office but that the office in question was a storage area. Thompson responded that he has always been up front with the Board in discussing the needs for his department, including storage and a conference type room. The Board directed Thompson to obtain quotes for relocating the dumbwaiter door for their consideration.

Moved by Buch, seconded by Vermedahl, to adjourn. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

Moved by Vermedahl, seconded by Buch, to table approval of the minutes of May 25, 2001. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

Rick Osterkamp met with the Board to discuss sealcoating approximately three thousand feet of 64<sup>th</sup> Street by Beau Chene Estates. Discussion was held regarding the cost of sealcoating and the various types of material. The county engineer advised that a three to four inch granular or macadam base with three inches of rock would cost approximately \$33,000.00 to \$34,000.00 or approximately \$11.00 per foot. Osterkamp reminded the Board that Linn County charges the developer \$8.50 per foot and the county pays for the remainder. The county engineer told the Board that maintenance on a sealcoated road would equal out with maintenance costs on a gravel road over a five-year average based on current prices. The engineer also informed the Board that the portion of road being discussed rated a 25 on the Paving Point Determination System and that usually a road needs a minimum of 50 before it is considered for upgrading to a paved road. Having fully discussed the matter, it was moved by Vermedahl, seconded by Buch, that

Benton County agrees to sealcoat approximately three thousand feet on 64<sup>th</sup> street leading to Beau Chene Estates. Further, 100% of the cost to sealcoat the road is to be borne by Rick Osterkamp with 50% being collected at the commencement of the project and the remaining 50% at the completion of the project. Benton County is to be responsible for the day-to-day maintenance of the sealcoated road. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried. It is noted that Osterkamp was in agreement with the financial arrangements for the project and the county engineer is directed to contact Osterkamp approximately one week prior to starting the project.

It is also noted that two other quotes were requested but none were received. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

Marc Greenlee discussed the need for a land use application when the applicant's existing home burned. Greenlee advised that the county's land use ordinance allows for a variance for an undue hardship. However the applicant must apply to the Board of Adjustment for the variance which requires a \$500.00 filing fee. Greenlee further stated that a regular land use application fee is \$500.00 and therefore recommended that the individuals be required to go through the normal land use application process. Moved by Buch, seconded by Vermedahl, to approve a farm exemption for George and Betty Whisenhunt in a Part of the SW1/4 of the NE1/4 of 35-82-12. Whisenhunts currently own 140 acres and are actively involved in a farming operation. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

The county attorney was unable to attend the meeting due to illness and therefore was unable to discuss issues concerning the county's telephone bill and contempt of court issues. Marc Greenlee updated the Board on his office's involvement with the contempt issue. Greenlee advised that Lane Rigler was violated Benton County's nuisance ordinance and land preservation ordinance. Rigler was ordered by the magistrate court to comply with the ordinances by May 24<sup>th</sup>. Greenlee advised that Rigler failed to comply with the court order. Greenlee advised that the necessary information was provided to the county attorney and the attorney's direction is being sought as to whether contempt action and/or additional citations should be filed. The auditor shall establish separate accounts for the appropriations authorized in Section 1, each of which account shall indicate the amount of the appropriation, the amounts charged thereto, and the unencumbered balance. The auditor shall report the status of such accounts to the applicable departments and officers quarterly during the 2001-2002 budget year.

Section 6. All appropriations authorized pursuant to this resolution lapse at the close of business June 30, 2002.

Representatives of East Central Iowa Council of Governments' Solid Waste Reduction met with the Board to discuss the county's current landfill and recycling efforts. Marie DeVries, a solid waste planner with East Central Iowa Council of Governments (ECICOG), advised that Benton County currently has a 28E agreement with every city in Benton County for landfill services and it would be necessary to ask each city to dissolve the 28E if that was the direction the supervisors wished to go. DeVries stated that Iowa law requires every county to have a waste management plan and waste reduction plan. The question of who was taking responsibility for waste reduction in Benton County was discussed and the need to reactivate the current landfill commission. DeVries spoke to financial involvement of the cities with recycling including end-user fees. It was decided that a meeting be scheduled for August 15, 2001, at 7:00 p.m. for the purpose of meeting with the city mayors and other county citizens to begin a process towards solid waste reduction.

Km Snook and Lisa Hennessey of the Iowa Department of Transportation met with the Board to discuss the driver's license days and hours in Belle Plaine. Currently the DOT is in Belle Plaine on Thursdays and Fridays of each week. Snook advised that the number of licenses being issued has dropped dramatically on Thursdays and was seeking the supervisors' input on reducing the number of hours the driver's license examiners were in Belle Plaine. The Board advised that they would prefer that the driver's license examiners remain in Belle Plaine on Fridays and possibly extending the hours. Supervisor Buch offered to poll various people in the Belle Plaine area and seek their reaction also. No action was taken.

The engineer met with the Board to discuss the purchase of the EDACS radio system from RACOM. The engineer explained why he believed the system would best meet the needs of his department, but agreed to delay the radio purchase and allow the Board time to research the matter. The engineer also agreed to request reimbursement of the down payment if the Board so desired and delay the purchase of a radio system. The Board assured the engineer that his FY02 budget would be amended to include the reimbursement as additional spending authority. **WHEREAS**, Iowa Code section 28E.1 permits political subdivisions to make efficient use of their powers by enabling them to provide joint services with other Public Agencies and to cooperate in other ways of mutual advantage, and to exercise and enjoy jointly any powers, privileges or authority exercised or capable of being exercised by one Public Agency of this state or private agencies for the joint or cooperative action; and

**WHEREAS**, Iowa Code sections 331.555 and 384.21 empowers Cities, City Utilities, and Counties to invest their moneys pursuant to a joint investment agreement; and

**WHEREAS**, Benton County is a political subdivision organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws and Constitution of the State of Iowa and have approved the Joint Powers Agreement and Declaration of Trust and thereby they have established the Iowa Public Agency Investment Trust as of October 1, 1987, and amended as of May 1, 1993; and

**WHEREAS**, this Governing Body desires to adopt and enter into the Joint Powers Agreement and Declaration of Trust, and it is in the best interest of this Governing Body to participate in the Iowa Public Agency Investment Trust for the purpose of joint investment of moneys with other cities, city utilities and counties to enhance investment earnings to each; and

**WHEREAS,** this Governing Body deems it to be advisable for this Public Agency to make use, from time to time, of the Fixed Term Automated Investment Program available to Participants of IPAIT;

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

Section 1. The Joint Powers Agreement and Declaration of Trust is approved and adopted. This Public Agency joins with the other public agencies in accordance with the Joint Powers Agreement and Declaration of Trust, as amended, (the "Declaration of Trust") which is incorporated herein by reference with the same effect as if it had been set out in this resolution by becoming a Participant of IPAIT. The Joint Powers Agreement and Declaration of Trust is filed in the minutes of the meeting at which this Resolution is adopted. The authorized officials of this Public Agency are directed and authorized to take such actions and execute documents as may be deemed necessary and appropriate to effect the entry of this

Public Agency into the Declaration of Trust and adoption thereof by this Public Agency and to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution.

Section 2. This Public Agency is authorized to invest its available moneys from time to time and to withdraw such moneys from time to time in accordance with the provisions of the Declaration of Trust and the Fixed Term Automated Investment Program of IPAIT.

Payment for any investments made within the Fixed Term Automated Investment Program is authorized from the Public Agency's specified IPAIT Account. Interest and principal payments must be credited to the Public Agency's designated Trust Account. The Custodian will hold investments in the name of IPAIT for the account of the Public Agency.

The following officers and officials of this Public Agency and their respective successors in office each are designated as "Authorized Officials" with full power and authority to effectuate the investment and withdrawal of moneys with this Public Agency from time to time in accordance with the Joint Powers Agreement and Declaration of Trust.

Section 3. The Trustees of IPAIT are designated as having official custody of this Public Agency's moneys which are invested in accordance with the Joint Powers Agreement and Declaration of Trust and any moneys invested in accordance with the Trust's Fixed Term Automated Investment Program.

Section 4. IPAIT is authorized to designate and name depositories and to file form CPE-31019, to execute documents, and to take actions as may be necessary to purchase and make payment, sell, secure, or take payment of principal and interest. Certificates of deposit must be purchased only from financial institutions designated by IPAIT which are approved depositories as prescribed by Iowa Code chapter 573.

Section 5. Authorization is given for members and officials of this Public Agency to serve as Trustees of IPAIT from time to time if selected as such pursuant to the provisions of the Declaration of Trust.

Section 6. Unless otherwise expressly defined, words that are capitalized in the Resolution have meanings defined in the Joint Powers Agreement and Declaration of Trust.

The Benton County Board of Supervisors met in regular adjourned session at the Van Horne Emergency Response Station in Van Horne, Iowa, with Supervisors Sass, Vermedahl, and Buch present. Chairman Sass called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Moved by Vermedahl, seconded by Buch, to approve the minutes of September 14, 2001. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

Moved by Buch, seconded by Vermedahl, to approve a utility permit for the East Central Iowa REC to place utility lines in Section 2 of South Polk. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

The time of 7:15 p.m. having arrived, and this being the time and date set for a public hearing on widening the county's road right-of-way south of Van Horne, the Board took up the matter for discussion.

Myron Parizek, Benton County Engineer, explained the need for the public hearing and the necessary legal requirements. The public hearing is for the purpose of hearing comments on the county's intent to widen the right-of-way and acquire the necessary land. Widening the right-of-way is necessary to aid in snow removal and drift prevention and to allow more sloping of the ditch for safety. The engineer reported that he had not received any comment either for or against the project prior to tonight's hearing. He further advised that notice of this hearing had been published in all official papers. Graham Land Acquisition was introduced to those in attendance and their services were discussed. The engineer explained that he did not have the time or the resources to meet with each individual landowner to negotiate the acquisition of the property. The engineer explained that if all other projects went according to plan, the county would start on the project in the near future with a completion date of this fall or early spring. Items discussed by those in attendance included but was not limited to the following:

- 1. lack of communication between the property owners and Benton County,
- 2. potential damage to the existing road surface,
- 3. acquisition of the property and purchase price,
- 4. possibility of condemnation of property,
- 5. property values,
- 6. future communication with property owners,
- 7. damage to septic systems discharging into the ditch,
- 8. relocation of utilities,
- 9. if detours would be necessary,
- 10. erosion control,
- 11. property lying within the Van Horne city limits

Hearing no further comment, Chairman Sass closed the public hearing at 8:00 p.m.

Mike Beumer, Benton County Weed Commissioner, and Dale Peterson, Department of Transportation spoke about planting native vegetation in the right-of-way after the widening project was completed. Peterson explained about native vegetation planted by the State. Peterson cautioned that native vegetation takes time to establish and requires proper maintenance, but once established it virtually eliminate the need for weed control. Beumer welcomed the property owners to contact him if they had specific concerns regarding the plantings.

The county engineer then spoke to the Board about the relocation of existing utilities specifically Alliant Energy. Alliant will move their utilities but the county would be required to reimburse Alliant for the cost. Moved by Vermedahl, seconded by Buch, to table action on the relocation of utilities until the Board has had the opportunity to review the matter. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

Discussion returned to the road right-of-way-widening project with questions as to the need for the project. Persons present asked if the snow-drifting problem could be accomplished through the erection of snow fences. The engineer advised that erecting snow fence was too labor intensive, adding that the safety aspect of the shoulders and slope would still need to be addressed. The engineer added that the widening project was necessary if the county was to continue to receive farm-to-market funds from the State for that road.

Hearing no further comment, the Chair called for a motion relative to the widening of the road right-of-way. Moved by Vermedahl, seconded by Buch, to adopt Resolution #01-77. Voting "aye" were Sass, Vermedahl, and Buch. "Nays" none. Motion carried.

# KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

**WHEREAS**, the Benton County Secondary Roads Department, (hereinafter referred to as Department) acting through the Board of Supervisors, Benton County, Iowa, is undertaking the improvement of County Road V66, approximately 1.5 Miles south of Van Horne, in Sections 23, Township 83 North, Range 11 West of the 5<sup>th</sup> Principal Meridian, and

**WHEREAS**, IES UTILITIES, INC., (a.k.a. ALLIANT ENERGY CORPORATION), (hereinafter referred to as IES), an Iowa corporation, with principal offices at Cedar Rapids, Iowa, is the owner of an electric transmission line which is located primarily on private property under permanent easement and is to be taken by the Department for road purposes, and

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Through mutual agreement, it has been determined that said transmission line, presently located primarily on private right of way, will be affected by this project. Department will reimburse IES to adjust its transmission line to accommodate the road improvements.

2. IES agrees to adjust and/or relocate its electric transmission structures along County Road V66 in Sections 23, Township 83 North, Range 11 West of the 5<sup>th</sup> Principal Meridian, Benton County, Iowa, to accommodate road improvements to be made in 2001 by Department.

3. Through mutual agreement, it has been determined that said transmission line, presently located primarily on private right of way, will be affected by this project. Department will reimburse IES to relocate its transmission line structure to accommodate the road improvements.

4. Department agrees to pay IES 100.00% of the actual costs for relocation of a transmission structure on private right-of-way, up to and including ( $\pm 10\%$ ) of the project <u>estimated</u> cost of \$17,306.74.

5. Department acknowledges that IES is not relinquishing any of its easements by entering into this agreement, nor is IES relinquishing it's right to maintain this line.

This agreement shall extend to and bind the successors and assigns of the parties hereto.

- 2. Concerns over septic systems being torn up with winter weather coming
- 3. That all of the county taxpayers help pay the cost of replacing the septic systems involved in this project since the project is to widen the right-of-way along a public road
- 4. Concerns that some property owners had already signed acquisition agreements before knowing about the septic system issue
- 5. Lack of research by county officials prior to the start of the project
- 6. Concerns over property owners being able to afford new septic systems without any prior notice
- 7. Other counties not making property owners replace non-code conforming systems
- 8. Cost of property to the county would increase to purchase remainder of the right-of-way
- 9. Possible condemnation proceedings
- 10. Requested the county to purchase existing home
- 11. Set-back regulations
- 12. Prior assurances from county officials that septic systems would not be an issue

The Board advised that the septic systems were illegal and would have to be replaced even if the county was to abandon the project. Supervisor Buch commented that the price of the land had already been agreed upon, but property owners may be able to negotiate with the county for damages.

Nelson advised that there would be additional costs to the county but that it may make it easier to calculate costs to other counties if a rental fee were

charged. Williams requested that the supervisors appoint a representative from their board to meet with Williams and a representative of the Ranch to review the current contract and determine what is in the best interest of both entities. Supervisor Buch agreed to meet with the other representatives to review the Cedar Valley Ranch contract.

Gary Fordice updated the Board on various activities in the conservation department. Fordice reported on a hog confinement system being expanded in Polk Township. Fordice also reported on easement concerns at Wildcat Park and problems with all terrain vehicles in various parks. Fordice spoke about construction of a cabin at Hannen Park. Fordice presented a letter signed by the conservation board requesting additional funding and budgetary authority for the construction of the cabin with an estimated cost of \$30,000.00. Supervisor Vermedahl questioned if any analysis had been done to ascertain the financial feasibility of having a cabin. Fordice responded that other similar cabins were in place in other state and county parks. Vermedahl requested Fordice prepare an analysis on the project before the Board of Supervisors considered the request. for operating the parks are paid from the general fund and the park revenue helps offset the costs to the taxpayers.

J.C. Fraker, Dave Thompson, Cindy Forsyth, Mary Williams, and Jackie Michael, met with the Board to discuss substance abuse and mental health commitments. Forsyth advised the Board that placement of involuntary commitments are becoming increasingly problematic due to Benton County's policy on non-payment of fees for private facilities. Forsyth stated that if an officer transports an individual to a hospital without a doctor's name on the committal, then the officer customarily has to wait at the hospital for six hours before the client is admitted. Forsyth commented that the reputation of Benton County with facilities has gone downhill due to the county's refusal to pay for placement. Dave Thompson explained the process for substance abuse and mental health commitments including the county's statutory responsibilities. Thompson said the problem arises because Benton County complies with the statutes but does not have facilities willing to provide the necessary services without a contract in place. Thompson said on occasion, county deputies have transported individuals to facilities only to have the person denied admittance. Thompson advised that other counties have entered into fallback contracts for times when the University of Iowa Hospital is not available. Thompson advised that the county could spend between 20,000 to 60,000 thousand dollars a year that isn't currently being paid by Benton County. J. C. Fraker reiterated on the process and the problems being encountered. Fraker commented that if an individual is a danger to themselves or others, that he as magistrate has to address the matter. Fraker said if he has to deny a committal due to a facility or physician not being available, his order will have to state that reason.

Moved by Vermedahl, seconded by Buch, to approve a ten-day vacation carry-over for Roger Witt. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Benton County Board of Supervisors that a variance to the requirements set forth in the Benton County Subdivision Ordinance be granted as follows:

2. The variance is limited to the 25 acre parcel located in the NE1/4 of the NW1/4 and the SE1/4 of the NW1/4 of 22-85-9 on which a land use change was granted in 1991

3. The variance is limited to the creation of five lots

3. The variance waives adherence to *Article 4 Improvements* of the Benton County Subdivision Ordinance #26, as amended.

The Board explained that the City of Shellsburg and Benton County are proposing to submit a joint Community Development Block Grant Application to the Iowa Department of Economic Development. The grant funds will be used to help finance improvements to the wastewater treatment system in Shellsburg in order to comply with a directive from the Iowa Department of Natural Resources. Specifically, the project involves the construction of an activated sludge/extended aeration treatment system. In addition, 1.87 miles of 6" force main and a lift station will be constructed to provide sewer service to the Timber Ridge Mobile Home Park.

The grant application will be submitted to the Iowa Department of Economic Development on December 6, 2001.

The City and County are requesting \$513,000 in grant funds for the proposed project. If the grant is approved by the State, the City intends to commit \$1,269,000 in matching funds from the SRF loan program.

The project will benefit the entire City of Shellsburg, as well as residents of the mobile home park. It was determined that 56% of the beneficiaries are of low-and-moderate income.

It will not be necessary to displace or relocate any homeowners as a result of the proposed program.

The Board then opened the hearing for public question and/or comment. Hearing none, the Chairman declared the public hearing closed.

Mary McLaughlin, Information Services Manager for Benton County, and the county treasurer and the county auditor met with the Board to discuss the purchase of financial, voter registration, and absentee voter software from Computer Management Services. McLaughlin explained that the county currently utilizes software from the same county for real estate, taxation, and receipting. The financial software being sought would be compatible with the software already being used. McLauglin further explained that IBM would no longer support the county's current hardware and consequently the county needs to move into a PC environment with new financial software. Moved by Buch, seconded by Vermedahl, to approve the minutes of November 27, 2001. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

Moved by Vermedahl, seconded by Buch, to set the date for a public hearing on a land use change requested by Jay and Amy Eggert for December 21, 2001, at 9:30 a.m. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

Moved by Vermedahl, seconded by Buch, to approve a farm exemption requested by John Stein in the NE1/4 of the NE1/4 of Section 31 of Fremont Township as the applicant is actively engaged in a farming activity. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

Barb Greenlee discussed the county's involvement in the lead program and the mandates being handed down by the State of Iowa affecting the health department. Greenlee also discussed the Grants to Counties program and the mandate from the State that the program be conducted electronically which may require additional equipment in the health department. Greenlee also advised that the health department no longer desires to administer the lead-testing program in Benton County. Greenlee advised that the lead testing could be done by other agencies. This would eliminate the need for the sanitarian to maintain lead-testing certification, the time involved to administer lead testing, and the additional costs to the county's health department. Supervisor Vermedahl commented that he did not believe the Board was in a position to take any action on the request of Greenlee to discontinue the lead program until further research could be done.

Scott Hansen spoke to the Board about problems being encountered with rural addressing. Hanson advised that due to housing developments, the county is beginning to run out of addresses in some areas. Hansen stated that he was going to have to either renumber those residences in developments by assigning lot numbers or look at some other type of numbering system. Hansen also commented that some post offices are having problems with processing the mail when lot numbers are assigned to one rural address due to their automated equipment. The Board agreed that renumbering those residences within subdivisions by assigning lot numbers should be done as required by county ordinance.

The county engineer discussed the TEA-21 applications received from the East Central Iowa Council of Governments for the purpose of prioritization. Moved by Buch, seconded by Vermedahl to table action on the applications until December 7, 2001. All members voting "aye" thereon. Motion carried.

Tracy Mulcahey met with the Board to discuss the Down Payment Housing Assistance Grant the county received. Mulcahey explained that she currently has sought applicants within the communities that made local matches; however she has been unable to secure any applicants. Mulcahey spoke to the Board about broadening the grant area to include other areas of the county. The grant expires in March of 2002 but an extension will be requested. apply for the grant funds to the remainder of the county, except in areas currently applying for and who subsequently receive similar grant funds. All members voting aye thereon. Motion carried.

The Board discussed the lack of substance abuse recovery facilities and services in Benton County. No action was taken.

Discussion was held regarding the county shed in Norway. Gary Boddicker spoke about the city's street not being able to stand up to the wear caused by the county's maintainer when it goes in and out of the county shed. Boddicker stated that the damage to the road is not due to the maintainer operator but rather the equipment. The city is requesting support from the county in maintaining and/or improving the street.

The Board advised the regulating of confinement facilities was under the jurisdiction of the Department of Natural Resources, and that agricultural uses were exempt from the county's land use ordinance.
