The Benton County Board of Supervisors met in regular session with Supervisors Seeman and Bierschenk present, Primmer called in. The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. at the conference room at the Benton County Service Center. Members of the public were provided the zoom access capability to join in during open session and livestream at https://www.youtube.com/bentoncountyiowa. *Unless otherwise noted, all actions were approved unanimously. Bierschenk moved/Primmer seconded: To approve the minutes of Tuesday May 17, 2022. Motion carried. **Primmer moved/Bierschenk seconded:** To approve payroll checks numbered 142261 through 142278, ACH Deposits 49270 through 49416, handwrite claim 242512, claims numbered 242513 through 242655 and vendor checks 242656 through 242662. Motion carried

Bierschenk moved/Primmer seconded: To approve claim for True North in the amount of \$2,952.00 paid for out of the ARPA fund for the radio project. Motion carried.

Primmer moved/Bierschenk seconded: To appoint Amanda Seiler as a Medical Examiner Investigator. Motion carried. Bierschenk moved/Primmer seconded: To approve use of the courthouse lawn for Vinton Parks and Recreation Department to use the courthouse lawn on June 16, 2022 and October 29, 2022. Motion carried.

Katie Cox, Benton County Public Health Director provided a COVID-19 update to the Board. After reviewing data from the week before, there were 40 new cases in Benton County. The vaccination status is looking good, with approximately 58% of the population is fully vaccinated. There have been 77 deaths in Benton County from Covid-19. There are still ongoing walk-in clinics throughout the county as well that are being helped by area pharmacies too. Cox wanted to discuss ways to work on communicating with the public and looking at a few options such as an app or web page. The Auditor will get in touch with Cox to see about integrating public health into the county's current updated website. Cox said she would be back at a later date after fiscal year end and give an outlook for the future year.

David Thompson provided an update on the courthouse clock. It has been removed and currently is in the Twin Cities for the needed repairs and might not be back until next spring.

Bierschenk moved/Primmer seconded: To approve and authorize signature for the Sixth Amendment to the Community Partnership for Protecting Children (CPPC) and Decategorization Services (DECAT) contract from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023 in an amount not to exceed \$42,206.64. Motion carried.

10:00 was the date and time set for a public Hearing for road classification change for 11th Ave. between 72nd Street and 72nd Street Drive. (HWY 30) No media was present. Terry Schwab and Doug Kozik, residents of the area were present. The Engineer presented the technical information such as those property owners and utility companies that were given notice. Parizek talked to Terry Ulch on the phone, but heard no opposition to the change. Schwab was concerned about a bridge in his area, and along with Kozik discussed their concern with traffic and asked that the sheriff be informed to keep a watch in this area. After hearing no other comments. The public hearing was closed.

Bierschenk moved/Primmer seconded: To approve Resolution #22-42, Road Classification Change. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION #22-42

WHEREAS: Benton County desires to classify certain roads on the area service system in the County to provide for a minimal level of maintenance and access by means of a gate or barrier, and

WHEREAS: The County, after consultation with the County Engineer, has the authority to specify certain roads within the County as Area Service "C" roads, pursuant to Iowa Code section 309.57, and

WHEREAS: The County is requesting that the following road be classified as an Area Service "C" road:

All of the road (11th Avenue) commencing at a point approximately 100 feet north of the SW 1/4		
All of the road (11 Avenue) commencing at a point approximately roo rect north of the GVV /4		
corner of Sec. 29, T83N, R12W of the Public Roadway (73rd Street); thence north to a point 50		
feet south of the W 1/4 corner of Sec. 29, T83N, R12W of the Public Roadway (72 nd Street Dr).		
Total road length of approximately 0.5 miles. and		
All of the road (11th Avenue) commencing at a point 50 feet north of the W 1/4 corner of Sec. 29,		
T83N, R12W of the Public Roadway (72 nd Street Dr); thence north to a point 50 feet south of the		
NW ¼ corner of Sec. 29, T83N, R12W of the Public Roadway (72nd Street).		
Total road length of approximately 0.5 miles.		

WHEREAS: The maintenance on all Area Service "C" roads will be as follows:

- 1. <u>Blading.</u> Blading or dragging will not be performed on a regular basis.
- Snow and Ice Removal. Snow and ice removal will not be performed on a regular basis. Sanding and salting will not be performed.
- 3. <u>Bridges</u>. Bridges on Area Service "C" roads may not be maintained to carry legal loads but will be posted as appropriate to advise of any load limitations.
- 4. <u>Weeds, Brush and Trees</u>. Mowing or spraying weeds, cutting brush and tree removal will not be performed on a regular basis. Adequate sight distances will not be maintained as on a regular road.
- Structures. Bridges and culverts may not be maintained on a regular basis to carry legal loads. Upon failure or loss, the
 replacement structure will be for the traffic thereon.
- 6. Road Surfacing. There will be no surfacing materials applied to Area Service "C" roads.
- 7. Shoulders. Shoulders will not be maintained.
- 8. Crown. A crown will not be maintained.
- 9. Repairs. There will be no road repairs on a regular basis.
- 10. Uniform Width. Uniform width for the traveled portion of the road will not be

maintained.

- 11. Inspections. Regular inspection will not be conducted.
- 12. The gate shall be purchased and installed by the County and maintained by

the adjoining landowners. If not so maintained, the County may remove the gate.

WHEREAS: The only persons who will have access right to the road shall be:

- 1. The Owner, lessee, or person in lawful possession of any adjoining land.
- The agent or employee of the owner, lessee or person in lawful possession of any adjoining land.
- 3. Any peace office.
- 4. Any magistrate.
- 5. Any public employee whose duty it is to supervise the use or perform

maintenance of the road.

6. Any agent or employee of any utility located upon the road.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED By The Board of Supervisors of Benton County that this County does hereby establish the road described above as an Area Service "C" road, with restricted access and a minimal level of maintenance.
