#### RESOLUTION #25-96

### PROMOTABLE POSITION DIFFERENTIAL

WHEREAS, Benton County and the Chauffeurs, Teamsters & Helpers Local Union No. 238 are parties to a Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA); and

WHEREAS, the Benton County Sheriff's Office and the Union have negotiated and mutually agreed upon modifications to the CBA, specifically the creation of a new Article 28 titled Promotable Position Differential, and the renumbering of the previous Article 28 (Duration of Agreement) to Article 29; and

WHEREAS, the parties have agreed in writing to a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA), signed in November 2025.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Benton County Board of Supervisors that the Memorandum of Agreement between the Sheriff's Office and the Union is hereby approved, and the following changes to the Collective Bargaining Agreement shall take effect immediately:

1. Creation of New Article 28 – Promotable Position Differential
The following language shall be added to the CBA as Article 28:

Employees promoted to First Line Supervisor positions—defined as Patrol Division Sergeants, Corrections Division Sergeants, and Lead Communication Specialists in the Communications Division—shall receive an additional \$1.00 per hour for all hours worked.

Detectives, while not classified as First Line Supervisors, are designated as Specialized Promotable Positions and shall receive an additional \$1.00 per hour for all hours worked. Employees in the promotable positions listed above shall not receive the additional \$1.00 per hour Training Pay referenced in Article 18.

Employees in these promotable positions shall not receive retroactive pay for this differential. The additional \$1.00 per hour shall begin on the date of Board approval of this Resolution.

Patrol Division Sergeants and Detectives are classified as promotable positions through the Civil Service Commission. Corrections Division Sergeants and Lead Communication Specialists are

designated as promotable positions within the Benton County Sheriff's Office but are not subject to Civil Service procedures.

# 2. Renumbering Articles:

The previous Article 28 (Duration of Agreement) shall hereafter be designated Article 29 – Duration of Agreement.

#### 3. Full Force and Effect:

Except as amended by this Resolution and the accompanying MOA, all other terms of the Collective Bargaining Agreement remain in full force and effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Benton County Board of Supervisors is authorized to sign the Memorandum of Agreement on behalf of the County effective this date. Passed and approved this 25th day of November. 2025.
