Volz moved/Tippett seconded: To approve Resolution #26-42, Temporary Promotion for Kelsey Robins as full-time collection manager. Tippett, Seeman and Volz voting aye. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION # 26-42

WHEREAS, the Benton County Attorney has a need for a full-time collection manager; and

WHEREAS, Kelsey Robins has been performing the duties of collections paralegal for a period of over 2 years and has demonstrated a superior understanding and application of the practices and procedures to collect unpaid criminal court debt; and;

WHEREAS, the county Attorney is recommending that Kelsey Robins become the temporary collections manager at a salary of \$60,000, sixty thousand,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Benton County Board of Supervisors that Kelsey Robins be temporarily promoted to the position of collections manager with a salary of \$60,000 effective immediately.
